- **School Loop** = Direct access to teachers and staff, daily assignments, announcements, weekly Bobcat Blast, etc. (Mobile App!)
- **School Messenger** = Important communications from school and district via email, text, and/or phone messages
- **ARIES** = Master database of contact information for all enrolled students in the District
- Bobcat Boosters on Facebook = Private account for currently enrolled families only
- **BorelBobcats.org** = Parent sponsored programming and events

What Do You Mean "There is NO Funding?"

Like most CA public schools, the community solicits contributions for critical supplemental funding that provides direct support to students, staff and families. We rely on generous contributions of our families and corporate sponsors to compliment public funding. We deeply value the menu of fundraising opportunities at Borel as we believe each of these contribute to a rich community for our students.

Borel Boosters = This is the primary fundraising campaign for our parent community providing direct support to the entire school. Every student is touched by these dollars. Click <u>here</u>. Additional fundraisers include a magazine sale giving kids an opportunity to fundraise for their school directly and a lovely luncheon called Table Art in the spring.

Music = The Borel Music Department has its own Boosters program that provides vital direct support for the thriving music program. All are invited to their fantastic concerts! For more information visit <u>here</u>.

Drama = Borel's Drama Dream Theater is a golden jewel within the District with wellregarded, high quality performances. The productions are entirely self-funded through donations and ticket sales. For more information visit <u>here</u>.

Athletics = Borel is fortunate to offer competitive athletics but it is 100% self-funded with no financial contribution from the state. Below are the TWO distinct funding vehicles.

The SMFC School District Middle Schools (Bayside, Bowditch, Abbott & Borel) all participate in the <u>Art David Athletic League</u>. This league includes middle schools from as far south as Palo Alto to Half Moon Bay and offers multiple sports for boys and girls with three distinct seasons. The SMFC Education Foundation provides funding District-wide for coaches, referees, limited uniforms and rental fees to host competitions. Each athlete is asked for a voluntary donation of \$150 per sport to help cover these costs. For more information, visit <u>here</u>.

While the SMFC Education Foundation sponsors District-wide team sports, our Bobcat Teams rely on our community to provide direct funding for equipment, field rentals for practices, t-shirts when uniforms are not supplied, etc. The primary fundraiser is in the Spring. What Does a Year as a Bobcat Look Like?

Below is a general overview of what to expect over the course of the school year. Check the calendar at BorelBobcat.org for specific dates.

AUGUST

- Head Start Day = Friday BEFORE school starts for all NEW families. Students get their schedules, pick-up PE clothes, families register on-line to stay connected through the various communication tools
- First Day of School = Home rooms posted for all returning 7th & 8th graders. Full class schedules will be handed out once they report to their home room.
- Back to School Night = Meet your student's teacher by rotating through the classrooms. This is often the SECOND night after school starts.
- Borel Boosters = Donate now!! ALL contributions needed!! Click <u>here</u>.

FALL

- > Fall sports: girl's volleyball, cross country, flag football and golf
