


harassment will help reduce occurrences of it in our school and will benefit students in high school and beyond.

will learn how to recognize the social and environmental factors that can enable bullying and harassment, how to safely challenge these factors, and how to seek help if they or someone they know is being bullied or harassed.

Here are just a few of many key definitions your child will be learning:

- Bullying: intentional physical, verbal, or social aggression. It's often repeated over time and occurs when there's a real or perceived power imbalance.
- · Bystander: anyone who's aware that bullying is happening
- Online bullying: the use of technology to harass, threaten, or intimidate another person
- Physical bullying: hurting someone's body or possessions
- Upstander: someone who stands up for a person being bullied

Please contact Assistant Principal Brilhart if you need support in reporting or dealing with bullying or harassment. Thank you for your support as we work together to build a bullying and harassment free community.
