It's pretty impressive that San Mateo County has established clear safety protocols so people can think on their feet and act in a safe way. As some of you felt or followed in the news, there was an earthquake in San Jose Tuesday. We did not have reports of shaking at Borel, but it's always a good time to review our Drop, Duck & Cover followed by Evacuate Protocol.



Do you have a family meeting place in case you need to evacuate due? Wednesday night we reviewed as a family our procedures in house and also where we'd meet up outside of our house. Reviewing procedures helps children feel more comfortable. If your child needs additional support to process this week's earthquake please reach out to our great counseling team.

As Halloween approaches, we want to review costume guidelines for those students who want to celebrate Halloween at school. Students may dress in costume if the costume can be worn without distraction to your child or others. Children may not bring any part of a costume that simulates a weapon, blood, violence, or any other inappropriate item (see planner for list.) If you are in doubt as to whether the item is allowed, please consult with us in advance. Any costume article of a violent/inappropriate nature will be taken away and held by the office until the end of the school day. In accordance with the District Wellness Policy, please do not have your child bring food/beverages to share. We appreciate your cooperation, thank you.

One practice my parents did for safety every year on Halloween was having us bring home all our candy for inspection before we dived in. Check for any tampered products and only eat store bought goods. The DEA shared recently that they are "advising the public of an alarming emerging trend of colorful fentanyl available across the United States. Since August 2022, DEA and our law enforcement partners seized brightly-colored fentanyl and fentanyl pills in 26 states. Dubbed "rainbow fentanyl" in the media, this trend appears to be a new method used by drug cartels to sell highly addictive and potentially deadly fentanyl made to look like candy to children and young people." If you see or hear anything related to this dangerous product, please alert authorities.
